Rock Eagle's primary location contains fifty-four cottages, holding up to 22 people each. Many border Rock Eagle Lake.

All cottages have a living room, private room with private bath and closet and two single beds, two group lodging rooms with four bunk beds, and two additional bunk beds in the main living room for a total of twenty two beds. All cabins have a large shower and restroom facility and are equipped with air conditioning and heat for the different seasons.

Rock Eagle 4H Camp gets its name from the Rock Eagle Mound nearby. Shaped like a prone bird, the Rock Eagle Mound is a stone effigy which measures eight feet high at the breast and consist entirely of milky quartz rocks. It was probably built about 2,000 years ago by Native Americans. Many believe it was built for religious or ceremonial purposes.

In 1978, the U.S. Department of the Interior listed the mound on the National Register of Historic Places. The only other recognized stone effigy mound east of the Mississippi River is Rock Hawk, also located in Putnam County, Georgia, near Lake Oconee.
